BACKGROUND TO THE THEATRE ROYAL BATH LTD (TRB)

The Theatre Royal Bath (registered charity 277723) is one of the oldest continually working theatres in the country, having originally opened in 1805. A Grade II* listed building, it is described by the Theatres Trust as "One of the most important surviving examples of Georgian theatre architecture". The Theatre Royal Bath comprises three auditoria – the historic Main House, the innovative Ustinov Studio and the Egg Theatre – which between them programme the best of UK touring and international theatre, many productions either prior to or direct from the West End; an ambitious programme of new writing and rarely seen plays; a mix of drama, comedy, ballet, opera and musical theatre and dedicated work for children and families throughout the year.

Regular visitors to the Main House include the National Theatre and the Royal Shakespeare Company, English Touring Opera, Rambert Dance and much-loved and award-winning UK actors including Felicity Kendal, Simon Callow, Nigel Havers, Patricia Hodge and Julian Clary programmed alongside international stars such as Ralph Fiennes, F Murray Abraham, Vanessa Redgrave and Barry Humphries. Recent years have also seen multiple sell-out successes from Mischief Theatre (creators of The Play That Goes Wrong) and the musical phenomenon SIX bringing in a new generation of theatregoers.

Since 2011, under the direction of first Laurence Boswell, and now the internationally acclaimed and multi-awardwinning opera and theatre director Deborah Warner, the 120 seat Ustinov Studio has transformed to an internationally acclaimed venue for innovative, creative theatre and performance. Recent successes include the world premiere of Florian Zeller's THE FATHER, which earnt an Olivier Award for Kenneth Cranham in the title role, and has become an Oscar winning movie; the provocative comedy BAD JEWS, literary thriller SWITZERLAND and powerful drama OLEANNA, all of which transferred to the West End after opening at the Ustinov.

In 2005, Theatre Royal Bath opened The Egg Theatre – one of the first venues in the country programming exclusively for children, young people and their families. The Egg has quickly built a reputation for high-quality productions, with its much-lauded Christmas productions including SNOW MOUSE becoming a national highlight. As well as a fully equipped auditorium, The Egg also provides a foyer café, workshop spaces and a roof-top rehearsal space which have all been designed to make the building as accessible to children as possible. The Egg is also home to a varied programme of creative learning, a thriving Theatre School and since 2016, the Bath Theatre Academy which offers full-time, level 3 qualifications for 16-19 year olds in performance and production arts.

The Theatre Royal Bath's charitable purpose is to provide high quality entertainment and creative learning opportunities for the community. In 2021, Theatre Royal Bath established the WONDERFUND as its commitment to ensuring Bath is the city where school children enjoy live performance for free.

In the last twenty years, Theatre Royal Bath Productions has become one of the country's most prolific producers and co-producers with productions touring nationally and transferring to theatres in the West End including the Duke of York's Theatre and the Harold Pinter Theatre every year. In 2022, no other theatre in the UK toured to as many venues nationwide as Theatre Royal Bath, with Main House productions & co-productions of PRIVATE LIVES, THE PLAY WHAT I WROTE, THE DRESSER, AN HOUR AND A HALF LATE, BEAUTIFUL: The Carole King Musical, THE HOMECOMING and The Egg's trailblazing production of JOSEPHINE seen in thirty-five cities and towns across the UK in the first six months of the year.

Objectives

- To achieve and maintain a high standard of excellence for the Theatre Royal Bath, in particular the Technical Department.
- To work as a member of the technical team in a professional and supportive manner

Key tasks and Responsibilities

- To fit-up and get-out according to requirements the lighting and sound for productions on the Main Stage, Ustinov Studio and *the egg* as directed by the Chief Electrician.
- To ensure the smooth technical running of all performances with a willingness to rectify at the earliest opportunity any faults that may arise, to the best that circumstances will allow.
- To work as required on the maintenance of the Theatre Royal Bath lighting and sound equipment, electrical installations, and provide PAT testing services for the Theatre Royal Bath and production company.
- To assist in the design and rig, as required, of the lighting and sound installations for in-house productions, Sunday concerts, and studio shows.
- To adhere to the guidelines and budget laid out by the Chief Electrician and Technical Manager.
- To ensure that maintenance programmes are fulfilled as directed and all appropriate paperwork and reports are completed.
- To program and operate the TRB lighting desks as directed, ensuring its back-up systems are functioning and basic maintenance is carried out.

- To be available as required to give talks, demonstrations and technical support for events organised by the Education and Operations Departments and for tours, Friends and Associates as required.
- To fulfil the Theatre Royal Bath Health and Safety regulations including fire procedures and the recording of any accidents in the book provided.
- To attend departmental meetings.
- To properly complete a timesheet for every working week, provide any information required by the Theatre Royal Bath; medical forms, holiday forms etc
- To abide by the financial coding, management and monitoring systems laid down by the theatre's Finance Department.
- To act always in the best interests of the Theatre Royal Bath

Special Responsibilities

- To fulfil the duties and responsibilities of the Deputy Chief Electrician in their absence, as stated in their job description and according to instruction from the Chief Electrician.
- To oversee and advise on the installation of touring sound equipment working with touring production engineers and sound designers.
- To undertake any further training as necessary.
- To oversee the in-house stock of sound equipment and ensure maintenance is carried out when needed.
